

With the first state of the Moon plate facing p. 34, having the two dark blue blots on the moon. The publisher's imprint at foot of spine in red in plain, unserifed type, with "CO." set in ordinary fashion, (only a few unobtainable presentation copies with the green publisher's imprint we issued before this issue). The verso of the title-page plate is blank, bearing no copyright notice. Also with the following first issue points: on p. [2], the publisher's advertisements are boxed; on p. 14, line one begins "low wail on..."; p. 81, fourth line from bottom has "peices"; p. [227], line 1 begins: "While Tin Woodman..."; and the colophon in eleven lines and boxed, with the initial letter in color; with perfect type in the last line of p. 100 and p. 186. and the plate facing p. 92 in the second state with the red shading on the horizon removed. Quarto. 259, [1, blank], [1], [1, blank] pp. Twentyfour inserted color plates (including title). Original light green cloth pictorially stamped and lettered in red and a darker green Pictorial pastedown endpapers (issued without free endpapers). Spine extremities and inner hinges with a bit of expert restoration. A very tiny bookseller stamp on first blank leaf. With the "Explanation of the Engravings" leaf at the end, perhaps by Fuseli (often lacking). Full treecalf, with an old rebacking, to style. Boards triple-ruled in gilt. Spine stamped and lettered in gilt. With a red and black morocco spine label, lettered in gilt. All edges speckled red. Marbled endpapers. Some wear to board edges and to extremities. Previous owner's armorial bookplate on front pastedown and a small bookseller label on front pastedown. Occasional very minor offsetting or light foxing to leaves, generally not affecting engravings. With half-titles as called for but without the 32-page publisher's catalogue (dated October 1847) in Vol. 1., and without the inset catalogue fly-title dated June 1847 and the inset leaf on thicker paper advertising The Calcutta Review. Many copies lack these two haphazardly inserted elements, e.g. the Richard Manney copy (Sotheby's New York 1991) and the presentation copy at the Pierpont Morgan Library. Rebound in half blue morocco over blue cloth. Spines ruled and lettered in gilt. Top edges gilt. Marbled endpapers. Two previous owner's bookplates on front endpapers of each volume. An old bookseller description tipped in to front free endpaper of volume 1. Some light foxing to blanks and half-titles of each volume. Also some light foxing to the fore-edge of the text block. Δ bit of light marginal soiling throughout. Overall a very nice set, housed together in a slipcase. 65653. \$35,000

"The Most Valuable And Accurate Work On South Africa Published Up To The First Quarter Of The Nineteenth Century"

BURCHELL, William John. Cravels in the Interior of Southern Africa. 1822. First edition. Two quarto volumes. Bound without half-titles and final blank in first volume but with the 4 pp. "Hints on Emigration to the Cape of Good Hope" (which was printed separately in 1824 and not found in all copies), and the half-page errata slip at the beginning of Volume 1. Large folding engraved map, twenty hand-colored aquatint plates (five folding), and ninety-six wood-engraved vignettes (fifty in Volume 1 and forty-six in Volume 11). Contemporary purple morocco, expertly rebacked to style over blue morocco. Covers with elaborately gilt panels, spines with gilt compartments and lettering, all edges gilt. Some offsetting from plates, map with some minor fold tears. ZZ4 of volume 11 with a one-inch tear to upper blank margin (not affecting any lettering). Hinges starting. With previous owner's bookplate on front pastedown of each volume. Overall, a very good, tight and clean copy. 64970.

Folio in fours (collated exactly like Pforzheimer). Engraved frontispiece portrait of Chaucer surrounded by the arms of his progeny (copied from the original by John Speed first used in the 1598 edition), large woodcut arms of Chaucer on divisional title to the Works (first used in the 1561 edition, here dated 1569). Black letter. Double columns. Signature c1 is signed "d". Full modern calf. Boards ruled in blinds and tooled in blind floral pattern. Spine stamped and ruled in gilt. Original brown morocco spine label, lettered in gilt. All edges brown. Newer endpapers. Bottom half of fore-edge and text block with a dampstain throughout, it occasionally creeps onto the lower quarter of the text. A bit of toning to leaves. Overall very good. 65868.

Large woodcut on title of Julius Caesar enthroned and surrounded by eight counsellors, with Cicero shown writing in the background, large woodcut portrait of Schwarzenberg by Weiditz after Dürer on verso of title, and 101 woodcut illustrations in the text, including ninety-nine by Hans Weiditz and one by Hans Burgkmair. Modern antique-style mottled calf. Spine ruled in gilt and decoratively tooled in blind in compartments, the blind tooling extending onto the covers, with black morocco gilt lettering label. Exceptionally Rare In Parts

DICKENS, Charles. Adventures of Oliver Twist. 1846. First edition of the very rare ten monthly parts issue. Octavo. The twenty-four plates are those used for the original Bentley magazine issue, re-touched, re-bitten, and "enhanced" by the engraver Findlay, and with the Bentley imprints erased. Cruikshank also designed the front wrapper for the parts issue, with very attractive, well-balanced, and appealing results. The set at hand collates complete with all the plates, text and advertisements according to Hatton & Cleaver's description pp. 215-224. All wrappers correct and complete as well. Some of the parts professionally rebacked, or with other small neat repairs. Part VII front wrapper has been extended in bottom margin, but still a bit short. Front wrapper of part V and back wrapper of part VII trimmed a bit short on bottom margin. Back wrapper of part X slightly soiled. The usual rubbing and foxing to parts. One of the most difficult works of Dickens to find in parts. Period ownership inscription on the front wrapper of parts IV, VI and VIII. Still a handsome set. Each part with two engraved plates, with the exception of part 1, as it states on the bottom of the front wrapper "The Illustrations for this Number will be given with the Next." Each number states this on the bottom of the wrapper "the text probably being set in type as soon as the English number was received and printed at once without waiting for the engraving of the plates for that number, so that the plates were always one number behind the text." (Wilkins, pg 25). Number xix-xx was issued with only two plates total. The last two parts bear the imprint "John Wiley." Original grey-brown printed wrappers. Some soiling and staining to wrappers. Many wrappers chipped along edges and spines. Number xix-xx with back wrapper crudely repaired along back joint. Pages foxed as usual for American stock. Beautiful First Issue In The Original Red Cloth

Publisher's catalog dated November 1859 present. All eight of Smith's internal flaws necessary for the first issue present, including page 213 misnumbered 113. Publisher's primary binding of deep red sand-grain cloth, covers stamped in blind, spine lettered in gilt. Pale yellow endpapers. Edges uncut. Cloth on boards is still a vibrant red. Spine is slightly darkened. Minimal wear to the top and bottom of the spine. A small bit of spotting to the cloth. Some occasional very light foxing. Housed in a quarter red morocco clamshell case. The First Edition Of Donne's "Poems" And "Juvenilia"

DONNE, John. *Doems, by J.D. With Elegies on the Authors Death.* 1633. [Bound together with]: **DONNE, J.** *Juvenilia, or Certaine Paradoxes and Droblemes.* 1633. First edition of the principal collection of Donne's poetical works, issued two years after his death with a first edition of his "perfectly impudent" Juvenilia. Small quarto. Poems with the rare two leaves (signed Δ and Δ2) containing "The Printer to the Understanders" and "Hexastichon Bibliopolæ," not present in all copies. Leaf Nn1 with thirty-five lines of text on p. 273 instead of thirty or thirty-one, with omission of the usual running headline. With numerous woodcuts throughout both books. 19th century full brown calf, rebacked with spine laid down. Boards tooled in blind. Spine lettered in gilt. Δ bit of staining to lower edge of front board. Top edge trimmed close, occasionally affecting decorative line at top and pagination of Poems and a few of the running titles of Juvenilia.
